In addition to private practice, I currently work in the NHS within a community stroke and neuro rehabilitation team. My experience has included providing neuropsychological assessment, formulation, and treatment to support individuals and their families, presenting with a wide range of neurological presentations. I also provide consultation, training and supervision to multidisciplinary teams, and have supported with capacity assessments and differential diagnosis.

I focus on person-centred therapy that involves developing a shared formulation to guide any interventions. I incorporate trauma-informed approaches which recognise the importance of the therapeutic relationship. I also integrate other neuropsychological and therapeutic approaches, including cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT), Compassion Focussed Therapy (CFT), Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT) and Cognitive Analytical Therapy (CAT).
